INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS AND RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT AT HIT

Today it is difficult to talk of Research and Development (R&D) without the aspect of Intellectual Property and associated rights. It is actually dangerous for organisations or even governments to ignore IP rights especially now where knowledge has become the new oil, a major ingredient in the production process. "Continuous efforts on research and development (R&D) create perpetual knowledge capital which is one of the bases of the economic growth to be endogenous". Universities today have a huge task of making sure that there is continuous knowledge production or generation going on. The knowledge generated in the Universities through R&D helps grow nations through the creation of knowledge where knowledge capital is treated as the positive function of stock of physical capital. New inventions through efforts on R&D activities get protected by approval of patents rights. Further new research brings up new goods which are used as intermediate inputs for further invention and innovations.

It is important for staff at HIT to understand the nexus between R&D and Intellectual property. For the Institute to move to the creative and innovative stage, this relationship must be well understood by people who are involved in the generation of ideas. This is not limited to a special group of people, but to everyone who has ideas that can change the way we do things starting at HIT and beyond. "Research and development (R&D) includes activities that companies undertake to innovate, improve or introduce new products and services". It is often the first stage in the development process. The goal is typically to take new products and services to market and add to the company's bottom line. This process begins in the labs, libraries, classrooms and in the community of practices where ideas can be conceived through classroom impartation, laboratory experiments, social interactions, research and learning commons. It is not a secret that in the modern world, economic development is dependent on new ideas and new technologies that can fundamentally change the way we live, and further improve the quality of our lives and research and development plays a critical role for the success of companies large and small. Intellectual property rights seek to protect knowledge derived from R&D especially by firms involved in collaborations with others to ensure that the knowledge is not expropriated. The lack of intellectual property rights reduces the bargaining power of collaboration partners and increase costs of information for such partners.


It is important for HIT as a centre for knowledge generation to balance intellectual property systems to ensure that they provide proper motivation to invest in research and development, while ensuring that the spread and development of research results are not inhibited. Weak IPR regimes lead to low returns for those seeking to innovate. There is need for staff to have knowledge of IP instruments, skills to process IP output from R&D. We need to invigorate passion for knowledge on IP issues so that we may be able as HIT family internalize all IP processes and requirements. Academic staff must be in a position to identify ideas that can be protected whilst working with students so that the process of protection can be less difficult.

KOHA INTEGRATED LIBRARY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AN OPEN SOURCE SOFTWARE

The Library and Information services embarked on a journey to migrate from using a proprietary software for their Library Management System Needs. The same opportunity is being taken to transform the way catalogue records are being created from using AACR2 standards to using the RDA standards.

MAIN FEATURES ON KOHA INCLUDES:

- Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC)
 module which provides a simple and
 clear interface for library users to
 perform tasks such as searching for and
 reserving items and suggesting new
 items.
- Full catalogue module which enables library staff to capture details of all library items. It is MARC compliant, and also Z39.50 compliant, meaning data entry and exchange will be greatly simplified.
- Circulation module which fully automates borrowing and item management, integrating with the OPAC so users can see which items they have outstanding, for example.
- Acquisitions module which assists librarians with both acquisitions and more generally with budget management. Serials management and reporting modules perform functions that their names would suggest.

WHY MOVE TO KOHA? WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF KOHA?

- The major benefit to accrue will be directly saving from the annual subscription fees that were being paid to Mandarin Oasis for the use of their software for our service. Mandarin charges \$810USD and KOHA is a free open source software.
- KOHA's main strength is in it being Open Source as well as its web accessibility and ease of use.
- The system is also flexible for integration with other systems and has options for plug-ins. For the benefit of those who desire to understand, below is a brief description of the new System.
- The System is Web-based and there is no need to install the software on staff and user terminals. Koha supports all library house-keeping activities such as Acquisition, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serial Control, Patron Management, and OPAC.
- It also supports Web 2.0 tools. KOHA can be readily configured to the needs of each library and is updated with new features frequently.
- Easy access to information for library staff and users due to effective searching and issuing of items.
- Automation of alerts to remind patrons and staff about, for example, overdue items or arrival of new items.
- Reduced time of processing of library items, due to MARC and Z39.50 compatibilities.
- Online supervision becomes possible, reducing the line management responsibilities of senior staff.
- Library management becomes easier through automated collection of data and report generation.
- Through the acquisition module budgets can be more effectively managed.
- Koha brings together library users and staff, as both can see various aspects of the system and can
 work together more effectively to achieve each user's goals.
